Since the First Healthy Cities Conference in August 1995, Second Healthy Cities Conference in March 1999, both held in Kuala Lumpur; Mayors-mayors meeting in Malacca in 2000 and ASEAN Healthy Cities Conference in 2002 in Kuching, all participants had shared their experiences in implementing the Healthy Cities initiatives. The critical factors that contribute to the success and failures are the sense of ownerships and loyalty among healthy cities players. Through sharing of experiences, we were able to develop a MALAYSIAN style and approach in the implementation this initiative.
